



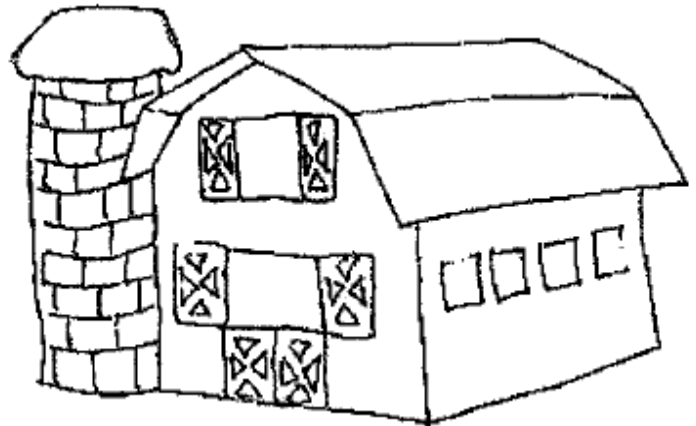
Gingerbread-By-Design

Barn with Silo Gingerbread House Pattern

Approximate size: 8" wide x 9" deep x 11" tall

Walls

Place four **wall pieces (A, B, A and B)** on your base so that four corners are touching. Apply a bead of frosting along the base and sides of each piece. Stand-up each wall, connecting pieces to each other at sides. Support with food cans if necessary.



Roof

Apply bead of frosting along top edges of wall pieces.

Attach **right roof piece C**, lining up with points on the front and back of barn sides. Hold until set. Support while drying. Attach **left roof piece C**, lining up with points on the front and back of barn sides. Apply frosting to top edges of both C roof pieces. Attach **right roof piece D**, lining up with points on the front and back of barn sides. Hold until set. Support while drying. Attach **left roof piece D**, lining up with points on the front and back of barn sides. Apply bead of frosting down middle of roof line, filling in any gaps in the roof. Let dry.

Silo Roof

Roll out the gingerbread dough and cut out a circular piece slightly larger than required. Spray the bottom of one cup of a muffin tin with a non-stick cooking spray. Drape dough and gently form it over the mold, making sure there are no cracks. Trim off extra with a sharp knife, taking care to cut as closely and evenly to the base as possible. Pierce the top of the gingerbread (as you would for pie crust to avoid air bubbles) and bake.

Silo

Cut a piece of 2 1/2" diameter cardboard tubing 8 1/2" in length. Apply frosting along side edges and back sides of silo wall sections (**pieces E**). Attach these to cardboard tube lengthwise. Let dry. Stand the silo on the bottom front corner of the barn where the notch is cutout of the roof. Using frosting, attach the barn cap to the top of the silo (**piece F**). Place your Silo Roof on top of your Barn cap.
